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Quick Checklist — 60s Conclusion Review

[] Synthesis

Have you built a fresh relation between key body ideas (not restatement)?

[] So-what

Does one sentence tell the reader why it matters here and now?

[] Echo

Is there a subtle echo of the thesis/motif without copying it?

[] Closure

Does the ending feel complete (no new evidence, no moralizing)?

[] Call-forward

Is there a concrete next step: task, application, or research path?

Tip — One-liners:

- Synthesis: “Taken together, these findings shift our understanding of ... by showing that ...”
- So-what: “This matters because ... in ... context/class/stakeholders.”
- Call-forward: “Next, we will ... (specific, measurable, near-term).”

Error Card 1 — Restatement-only ending

Before (weak ending / restatement / cliché)

I just repeat the thesis with synonyms.

After (synthesis + so-what + echo/closure)

Connect body ideas to create a new insight; show the shift in understanding.

So-what (why it matters):

Call-forward (next step):

Error Card 2 — New idea at the end

Before (weak ending / restatement / cliché)

I add fresh evidence not discussed before.

After (synthesis + so-what + echo/closure)

Keep evidence in the body; turn new thoughts into a call-forward.

Error Card 3 — Moralizing tone

Before (weak ending / restatement / cliché)

We should all do X because it's good.

After (synthesis + so-what + echo/closure)

Echo data-driven insight; keep tone academic and linked to evidence.

Error Card 4 — Cliché closers

Before (weak ending / restatement / cliché)

In conclusion, it is very important...

After (synthesis + so-what + echo/closure)

Use purposeful coherence signals tied to your findings.

Before (weak ending / restatement / cliché)

I summarized but didn't say why it matters.

After (synthesis + so-what + echo/closure)

Add a concrete consequence for your audience/context.

Error Card 6 — No call-forward

Before (weak ending / restatement / cliché)

I finish without a next step.

After (synthesis + so-what + echo/closure)

Propose one actionable next step: task, application, or study.

Conclusion Rewrite Canvas — One Page

Echo (return to thesis, briefly — no copy/paste)

Synthesis (link two key ideas/evidence to create new meaning)

So-what (why it matters here & now — audience/context)

Call-forward (specific next step: task / application / reading)

Final polish (tone, avoid moralizing, keep closure tight)
