# **Paraphrasing Ladder Worksheet**

This worksheet helps teachers guide students through a three-step paraphrasing ladder — from controlled substitution to free rewording. Use it for 15–20 minute practice cycles in speaking classes (A2–C1).

## **Step 1 – Controlled Practice**

Objective: Keep the meaning constant while changing basic sentence structure.

- Change the voice (active ↔ passive).
- Replace a clause with a noun phrase.
- Use synonym substitution without changing the message.

### **Step 2 – Guided Practice**

Objective: Experiment with form and emphasis based on prompts.

- Reorder ideas (Reason  $\rightarrow$  Result / Result  $\rightarrow$  Reason).
- Create a formal and informal paraphrase.
- Explain why one version fits the context better.

### Step 3 - Free Practice

Objective: Use paraphrasing naturally in spontaneous speaking.

- Paraphrase your partner's statement (e.g., 'So you mean that...').
- Summarize a 3-sentence opinion into one sentence.
- · Record and notice meaning shifts.

Tip: Repeat the same ladder weekly with new topics so students internalize paraphrasing as an automatic skill.
