# **Planning & Hook Templates Pack**

This printable pack helps ESL teachers and learners craft essay introductions using three patterns: Funnel, Contrast, and Anecdote.

### 1. Funnel Introduction Template

General  $\rightarrow$  Narrow  $\rightarrow$  Thesis

Example:

Many learners start writing without a plan.

In large classes, this habit leads to repetitive ideas.

This essay explains how planning improves clarity.

#### 2. Contrast Introduction Template

 $Common\ belief \rightarrow Counter\text{-view} \rightarrow Thesis$ 

Example:

Many think longer introductions sound academic; however, shorter ones engage better.

This essay argues concise openings improve clarity.

#### 3. Anecdote Introduction Template

Short story  $\rightarrow$  Context  $\rightarrow$  Thesis

Example:

A student froze at the first sentence. After using a 3-box plan, she wrote a focused opening.

This essay shows how planning boosts writing flow.

## Self-Check Rubric (0-2 each)

| Criterion          | 0               | 1                  | 2                           |
|--------------------|-----------------|--------------------|-----------------------------|
| Hook clarity       | Unclear         | Somewhat clear     | Catches attention           |
| Context relevance  | Off-topic       | Partially relevant | Smoothly connects to thesis |
| Thesis specificity | Too broad/vague | Some focus         | Focused and clear           |
